# Medicaid Managed Care Pharmacy Benefit Transition to Fee-ForService



### **Medicaid Pharmacy Benefit Transition**

- On April 1, 2023 the pharmacy benefit will shift from Medicaid managed care (Mainstream Plans, HARPs, and HIV SNPs) to the Medicaid feefor-service (FFS) pharmacy program, called NYRx
  - Will not apply to Essential Plan, Child Health Plus (CHP), or Medicaid Advantage Plus (MAP) Plan enrollees



### **NYRx Prior Authorization Process**

- Prior authorizations issued by Medicaid managed care plans prior to April 1<sup>st</sup>
   (that remain active/valid after April 1<sup>st)</sup> will be honored in NYRx throughout
   the authorization period assigned by the MMCP
  - Once the managed care prior authorization expires, a FFS prior authorization will be required
- Individuals prescribed a medication not on the <u>FFS preferred drug list</u> and who do not have an existing MMCP prior authorization will need to either switch medications or receive <u>NYRx prior authorization</u>
- DOH and its contractors have an automated prior authorization adjudication process where requests meeting clinical criteria are bypassed when justified based on managed care claims
  - Automatic approvals are generated 50% of the time



### **NYRx Transition Period**

- A three-month transition period (April 1 through June 30, 2023) will allow members to receive a one-time fill of a non-formulary/non-preferred product
  - This allows additional time for prescribers to either seek prior authorization or change to a preferred drug not requiring prior authorization



### **Prescriber Medicaid Enrollment**

- Prescribers and pharmacies must be enrolled in Medicaid FFS to prescribe or dispense prescriptions to Medicaid enrollees

# **Continuous Medicaid Enrollment Unwind**



### **Overview**

- NYS will begin conducting Medicaid recertifications in April 2023.
- NYS will have up to 12 months to initiate, and 14 months to complete, renewals for all Medicaid, CHP, and Essential Plan enrollees.
- All Medicaid enrollees, including those in Medicaid fee-for-service or managed care, and CHP enrollees, will be sent renewal notices describing the action needed, if any, to renew their coverage.
- To manage the volume, enrollees will maintain their regular renewal "cycles" so that approximately one-twelfth of the population will renew each month.



# **Ex Parte (Administrative) Renewal**

### **NYSOH**

- Received approval in October 2022 to conduct ex parte (administrative) renewals utilizing IRS data across all programs to assist with the PHE unwind
- E14 Waiver requests
  - SNAP
  - Zero income
  - Maintaining enrollment for individuals over 65 and dually eligible

#### **WMS**

- Auto renewal for non-MAGI with social security income
- E14 Waiver requests
  - SNAP MAGI and non-MAGI



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### **Member Renewal Notices**

- Members will be sent renewal notices describing any needed action to renew coverage and will maintain regular renewal "cycles."
- Enrollees will have 60 days to respond to renewal notices to prevent loss of coverage.
- DOH will mail Medicaid renewal notices to individuals using the address currently on file. There may be a significant number of people who can't be reached because of outdated mailing addresses or phone numbers.



## **Provider Agency Communications**

- OMH providers should encourage their clients to confirm accuracy of, or update, their contact information in the applicable Medicaid enrollment system.
  - Individuals enrolled through New York State of Health (NYSOH) can update contact information by calling NYSOH at 1-855-355-5777 or logging into their NYSOH account.
    - Individuals can also contact an enrollment assistor.
  - Individuals enrolled in Medicaid through their county's Medicaid office or New York City's Human Resources Administration can call or visit their <u>local office</u> to update their contact information.
