Where appropriate, 18 19 transfers to the department of health (DOH) shall be made as reimbursement for the state share of medical assistance. 20 Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, subject to the 21 2. 22 approval of the director of the budget and available appropriations 23 therefore, for the period of April 1, 2024 through March 31, 2025, the commissioners shall provide funding to support a one and five-tenths 24 25 percent (1.5%)two and eight-tenths and four-hundredths percent (2.84%) cost of living adjustment under this section for all eligible programs and services as determined pursuant to subdivision 26 27 fourfive of this section. 28 3. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, and as approved 29 by the director of the budget, the 1.52.84 percent cost of living adiustment 30 (COLA) established herein shall be inclusive of all other cost of living type increases, inflation factors, or trend factors that are newly 31 applied effective April 1, 2024. Except for the 1.52.84 percent cost 32 of 33 living adjustment (COLA) established herein, for the period commencing 34 on April 1, 2024 and ending March 31, 2025 the commissioners shall not 35 apply any other new cost of living adjustments for the purpose of estab-36 lishing rates of payments, contracts or any other form of reimbursement. 37 The phrase "all other cost of living type increases, inflation factors, 38 or trend factors" as defined in this subdivision shall not include 39 payments made pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act or other federal 40 relief programs related to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic public health emergency. Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision of law, the commissioners shall develop guidelines for local government units and direct contract providers on implementation of such targeted salary increase.

(a) For the office of mental health, office for people with developmental disabilities, and office of addiction services and supports, support staff shall mean individuals employed in consolidated fiscal report position title codes ranging from 100 to 199; direct care staff shall mean individuals employed in consolidated fiscal report position title codes ranging from 200 to 299; clinical staff shall mean individuals employed in consolidated fiscal report position title codes ranging from 300 to 399; and non-executive administrative staff shall mean individuals employed in consolidated fiscal report position title codes 400, 500 to 599, 605 to 699, and 703 to 799. Individuals employed in consolidated fiscal report position title codes 400, 500 to 599, 605 to 699, and 703 to 799. Individuals employed in consolidated fiscal report position title codes 601 to 604, 701 and 702 shall be ineligible for the 1.7% targeted salary increase established herein.

(b) For the office of temporary and disability assistance, office of children and family services, and the state office for the aging, eligible support staff, direct care staff, clinical staff, and non-executive administrative staff titles shall be determined by each agency's commissioner.
